

BAIN, THOMAS. (*North Wentworth.*)

S. of the late Mr. Walter Bain, of Denny, Stirlingshire, Scot., who came to Can. in 1837, and settled in West Flamboro', Ont. B. in parish of Denny, 14 Dec., 1834. Ed. in Can. M., 25 June, 1874, Helen, second dau. of John Weir, Esq., of West Flamboro'. A farmer. Was for several years Reeve of the tp. of West Flamboro', and in 1870 Warden of Wentworth. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1872; again by acclamation at g. e., 1874, re-elected at g. e., 1878, and again at last g. e. A Reformer.—*Strabane, Ont.*

BAKER, EDGAR CROW. (*Victoria, B.C.*)

Descended from an old English family, which traces its descent from 1310. Third surviving s. of Edward William Whitley Baker, of Liscard Park, Cheshire, Eng., formerly an officer in the Royal Navy. B. 16 Sept., 1848, at Lambeth, Surrey, Eng. Ed. at the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, at which he attained nomination into the Royal Navy by competition. M., 17 March, 1869, at the Parish Church, Bebington, Cheshire, Frances Mary, eldest dau. of Captain Richard Jones, of Halifax, N.S. Entered the Royal Navy 11 Sept., 1860, obtained first Commission 11 Sept., 1865, and Lieutenant's Commission 9 August, 1870. Was Navigating Lieutenant of H.M.S. "Niobe." Retired, with the relative rank of Major in the Army, 22 Sept., 1878. Is an Accountant, Notary, and Conveyancer. Was Accountant in the Provl. Treasury, B.C. Is secretary to the Board of Pilot Comms. and Superintendent of Pilots; secretary of the B. C. Board of Trade; secretary of the Victoria and Esquimaux Telephone Co., and Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Freemasons. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. A Conservative.—*Laurel Point, Victoria; Union Club, Victoria, B.C.; Rideau Club.*

BAKER, Hon. GEORGE BERNARD, M.A., Q.C. (*Missisquoi.*)

Third s. of the late William Baker, Esq., who represented Missisquoi in the L. C. Assem. from 1834 until the suspension of the Constitution of that Province in 1837; and nephew of Stevens Baker, Esq., who represented the County in the same body from 1830 to 1834; grandfather
