

BARR, HENRY (*North Renfrew*).

Fifth s. of the late David Barr. B. 21 March, 1844, in the Tp. of Horton, Co. of Renfrew. M., 1 Nov., 1865, Emily Cole. Is a farmer. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat in the Commons at g. e., 1891. First returned to Leg. Assem. at by-election held 1892, re-elected at g. e., 1894. A Liberal.—*Douglas*.

BAXTER, JACOB, M.D., J.P. (*Haldimand*).

Eld. s. of the late Jacob Baxter, of Bertie, Welland, Ont., and grands. of the late John Baxter, who came from Irel., and settled in Bertie towards the close of the last century. B. in Bertie, June, 1832. Graduated at the Medical Schools of Toronto and New York City. M., 1866, the third daughter of R. V. Griffith, Esq., Deputy Clerk of the Crown for Haldimand. Is Surgeon of the 37th Haldimand Rifles, and holds the rank of Surgeon Major. Has been Local Superintendent of Schools. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1867; and has sat continuously since then. Occupied the position of Chairman of the whole House during one Parliament. Was Speaker of the House from 10 Feb., 1887, until the dissolution of the House in 1890. A Liberal.—*Cayuga, Ont.*

BEATTY, WALTER, D.L.S. (*Leeds*).

B. 1836. Ed. at a Public School and at the Brockville Grammar School. Is a Dominion Land Surveyor, and served in the Intelligence Corps under Gen. Middleton in the North West Rebellion 1885. Has been Deputy Reeve of the Township of Bastard, and was Warden of the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville in 1890 and 1891. Is Presdt. of the Leeds Co. Conservative Assn. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g. e. A Conservative.—*Delta*.

BEATTY, WILLIAM RABE (*Parry Sound*).

Brother to Walter Beatty, M.P.P. Is Manager of the Beatty Line of Steamers, sailing on the Upper Lakes. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g. e. A Conservative.—*Parry Sound*.

BENNETT, JOHN (*Stormont*).

S. of the Hon. Thomas Bennett, late mem. for the Eastern division in the Leg. Council. B. at St. Polycarpe, P.Q., 1832, and ed. at the Public School. Is a farmer. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1896. A Patron.—*Roxborough, Ont.*
