

# Advanced ticket sales

## Regulations:

- 1) To be eligible to buy tickets, students must present their UNB-STU Identification card - There will be no exceptions.
- 2) A student will only be able to purchase a maximum of two tickets to a Winter Carnival event. Special conditions for the following events:
  - 1 ticket to Cabaret Lounge as this ticket entitles a couple to enter this event.
