Your LABOUR GAZETTE is, in a sense, a Carlylean monthly history of Canada. Its motto could very well be that statement of Carlyle's beginning, "Two men I honor and no third", and ending "...all else is chaff and dust."

If my plans do not fall through, I shall accompany a friend on a trip to Quebec early in August. I had hoped to leave in time to see the celebration there, but was disappointed. If it is possible, I shall stop off for a few hours in Ottawa. I presume I shall run very little chance of seeing you, because of your frequent absence from the city. Nevertheless, I shall call at the Department of Labour.
