I have your letter of 11th. This is the first I ever heard of the appointment to which you refer. The fact is I cannot get to Council because Senate Committees at which I have to be present are sitting all the time Council is sitting.

Have made enquiries today and find that the Secretary of State insisted on a Judge being appointed, and further, that there was considerable difficulty in getting one and that no fee of any kind is paid as the Dominion always observes the Judges' Act in this regard.
