In raply to your letter of the 3rd. instant im which you ask for the proof of the statement which reads as follows-"It is reported that the general usefulness of the institution outliers from this arrangement " I beg to say that every report received from our Inspectors since the arrangement in question went into operation has drawn attention to the fact that your frequent and long absences from the school were detrimental to the officient management of the institution. As constant changes in the staff always tend to preduce friction, I have to draw your attentions to the fact that since April of 1907 you have had at least four Assistant Frincipals and that the present insumbent of the office is about to sever his connection with the achool. It is not peace this that you could delegate your authority as Principal to an Ameistant Principal unless he be a very exceptional man and from the rate of pay which you have been allowing your Assistants it may be indeed that they are not highly qualified. Such changes in pateff would also seem to indicate that the Assistant Principals melves did not find their position congenial, although there is e direct evidence that such is the case.
