I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 17th instant and to inform you that the Department of the Interior has been notified to the effect that Lot No. 15, which you report is the property of the Storr family, is not to be included in the Order in Council confirming the Fairford Indian Reserve. The other lets to be excluded are:-

No. 14, H. B. Co.

- " 15, Mission.
- \* 31, \*
- " 32, Woods Claim.

With reference to the small triangle claimed by the Storr family as part of their lot, I have to say that the Department of the Interior has refused to make any change in the patent issued to the Hudson's Bay Company. You will note that this is a matter affecting Lots 14 and 15, which adjoin, of the Hudson's Bay Company and the Storr family respectively. The Department has, therefore, no interest in the matter.
