



Sir,-

With reference to your request of the 5th instant, I beg to say there has been sent you this day under separate cover by registered mail, blue prints on linen of the Key Indian Reserve No. 65, showing bordered in green the parcels on the east and on the west, which have been surrendered, and tinted in red, the present Indian Reserve; the plan of the Gambler's Indian Reserve No. 63; the plan of the Cote Indian Reserve No. 64, showing coloured in green the portion surrendered and bordered in red the present Indian Reserve; and also the plan of the Keeseekoose Indian Reserve No. 66, showing the surrendered portion coloured in green and the present reserve coloured in red.
