In further reference to your letter of the 9th ultimo; in which you request the discharge of the brother of Henry Campbell from the Duck Lake Boarding School, I beg to say that upon enquiries having been made, the Department has decided that it is in the best interests of this boy that he remain in the school.

Henry has his wife, his mother and his brother's wife to look after him if necessary, and it is therefore considered that the services of his brother are not required and he is to remain in the school.
