been duly sworn states:

I was ~~in~~ in Thent with the
accused, Plt S Law, on 2 Dec. last.
At about 1330 hrs on that day the
accused and I went to a 'Cafe'
at 30 Rue Thure St. Pierre, Thent.
We went there for a drink. We
had about 120 Belgian Francs.
We spent the Belgian money
in the 'Cafe'. We had Dutch
Guilder's left. An N.C.O. of British
Army accepted Dutch money
and paid the bar-keeper for the
drinks we had at that time.

Plt S Law asked the bar-keeper to
accept Dutch money and he
did accept the Dutch money.
After that we left the 'Cafe'
and went across to the Soldiers
Club, the N.A.A.F.I., and we were
picked up by the Provosts from
there. The bar-keeper said
he did not like taking Dutch
money but he did take it. There
was no argument. I did
not notice any civilians when we
entered the 'Cafe'. I did not
see any disturbance in the 'Cafe'.
I recognize the knife, exhibit "A"
as Plt S Law's knife. This knife
was found on me by Provosts.
I do not remember if I had the
knife before I went into the 'Cafe'.
Cross Examination:

We had been using the knife. It is
quite possible that it was in
my possession. We used the knife
for taking the corks out of bottles.
