The PRINCIPAL DESTROYER, says the author, in this exterminating process is of course the United States, not the people, who are a generous and a great nation; nor yet the Government, for a sufficiency of food and clothing is voted annually for their maintenance, for which indeed the natives bartered their lands, but these supplies never reach their destination. They change into dollars in their transit, and disappear into the pockets of the thriving Indian officials.
