Can a tenant remove oat sheaves from a rented farm, the terms of the lease being straw to be fed or left on farm? Ontario.

The statutory provisions in point are lengthy and somewhat elaborate, and we have, accordingly, to refer you to the statute books, at certain pages, for the desired information, viz.: Ontario Statutes, of 1901, at pages 106, 146 and 147; of 1906, at pages 450 and 451, and of 1907, at pages 377 and 378.

2, 3 and 4. As to these matters, and, indeed, with regard to all the questions you ask, it would be well for you to see the inspector, and have him show you the provisions applicable contained in the regulations, as well as those to be found in The Public Schools Act and amending Acts.

STORING CABBAGE FOR WINTER.

I would be glad to find out a proper way to put away cabbages for winter use. Cannot they be put away in moulds? How about beet roots?

A BEGINNER.


Ans.—Re keeping of cabbages during the winter season, as your subscriber suggests, these can be and are best kept out of doors beneath soil. Our plan is to turn the cabbages on their heads, setting them closely together in a bed, say, 4 feet to 5 feet wide, then putting a second tier above the first in between the stalks, these, also, being packed close together. After that, a small quantity of earth is put over, possibly two or three inches; and, if kept until late into the winter, we further cover them with stable manure to the depth of five or six inches. Beet roots can be either pitted the same as potatoes, or put in a root-house, in bins. If placed in house cellars, where the temperature rises above 40 degrees, where it is dry, they should be put into boxes, or cases, and covered, with earth put over in order to keep them from wilting. We use the word "bed" in reference to the pitting of cabbages; this is only to denote the form of placing, they being actually set on the surface of the ground.
