**Synopsis of Canadian North-West****HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.**

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may however be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.

The seven volumes, convenient in size aggregating nearly 3,000 pages, are divided as follows: One to Matthew, one to Mark, two to Luke, three to John. As indicated by the title, the work is pre-eminently expository in character. In his treatment of Matthew, Mark and Luke, the author divides the sacred Scriptures into passages of about twelve verses each, which, taken as a whole, serves as a basis for a continuous series of short, plain expositions. To this method he adds when treating the Gospel by John the verse by verse exegesis. The practical lessons and inferences from the passages given are followed by notes explanatory, doctrinal and hortatory, and the views of other commentators are presented from time to time.

The Bishop of Brechin (Dr. Robberds) has been unanimously elected Primus of the Scottish Episcopal Church in the room of the late Bishop Wilkinson. Dr. Robberds is one of several living Bishops who were once at St. Mary Redcliff, Bristol. He served there as curate under the present Bishop of Grahamstown from 1887 to 1892, and then came back as vicar when Canon Cornish went to the South African See in 1899. In 1904 Dr. Robberds became Bishop of Brechin.
