amine into and report upon such Laws as are about to expire, or have lately expired: and the Attorney General, Mr. Cameron, and Mr. Mabey, were appointed for that purpose.

Dr. M'Aulay, gave notice that he would on a future day, bring in a Bill to alter and amend the Election Law.

Mr. M'Gregor gave notice, that he would on a future day, bring in a Bill for regulating the Fisheries of this Island, and protecting the property embarked in the same.

Mr. Cameron moved for leave to bring in a petition from Mr. Theophilus Chappell, complaining of an undue Election for King's County; leave being granted, it was accordingly read and ordered to be submitted to a Committee of the whole House on Thursday next as a Committee of Privileges and Elections.

Mr. M'Gregor, Chairman of the Committee appointed to wait upon his Ex-

cellency the Lieut. Governor, to know when he would be pleased to receive the Address of this House in answer to his Speech, Reported that his Excellency had appointed three o'clock on Monday next.

The Attorney General moved that a Committee be appointed to prepare and bring in the draft of a Bill to promote and encourage the education of youth within this Colony: The Attorney General, Mr. Cameron, Mr. M'Neill, Mr. Campbell, and Mr. Owen, were appointed a Committee for that purpose.

Mr. M'Gregor moved for leave to bring in a perition from James Baker, a prisoner confined in the Gaol of Charlotte-Town, complaining of certain grievances therein stated, and praying for redress; it was read and ordered to he on the table.

Adjourned to 10 o'clock on Monday.

Mr. Cameron gave notice, that he would on a early day, bring in a Bill to repeal an act of this Island, intituled an Act declaring that Baptism of Slaves shall not exempt them from bondage."

Mr. Cameron gave notice, that he would also bring in a Bill to alter and amend a certain part of an act of this Island, intituled "an Act relating to Treasons and "Felonies."

Mr. Hodgson moved that a Committee be appointed to prepare and bring in a Bill for establishing an Assize of Bread in Charlotte-Town. Ordered accordingly, and that Mr. Hodgson, Mr. Mabey, and The Attorney General, be appointed a Committee for that purpose.

On Motion of Mr. M'Gregor, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take into consideration the Petition of James Baker.
