Japan's Mineral Wealth.

Among the many resemblances of Japan to Britain is, says the Lordon Engineering, the amount of its mineral resources. These of Japan, indeed, are much more varied. Not only in the northern island but also in the southern eru island but also in the southern parts of the empire, and to a greater or less extent in all parts of it, coal mining is rapidly becoming an extensive industry—a fact which increases the industrial importance of Japan, and adds immensely to her naval attength and to the value of the alliance with Britain; for in case of need the coal resorces of Japan would be at the disposal of the combined fleets. Twenty years ago, continues Engineering, the annual production of coal in Japan stood somewhere between 1/2 and 2 millions tons. Since then the output has increased more than five fold and there are no reasons for supposing that the supply will not hold out for many years to come. The extent of the mineral resources of Japan is not yet very accurately of Japan is not yet very accurately known, but there can be little doubt that there are many large deposits that have not yet been discovered.
