THE ORIGIN OF ROTTEN ROW.

The origin of the name of the famous resort has been the subject of much controversy among etymologists. The generally accepted explanation is that Rotten Row is a corruption of 'Route du Roi,' that is to say, the King's Road. This theory is assailed by the fact that there are scores of Rotten Rows in England and Scotland, many of which bore the names hundreds of years before the London Road was known.

These other rows took their names from the old word 'rotteran,' meaning to rot, and which survives in the modern 'rotter,' a file of six or twelve soldiers was known as a 'rot,' and Scotch antiquarians agree that their Rotten Rows were named because they were used as rotteran grounds, or places of muster for soldiers. In Cromwell's time this part of Hyde Park was put to similar use for squads of 'rotters' and spidiers and since then the name has survived.



More Heat in Soft Woods.

Contrary to the widespread belief that hard woods give more heat in burning than soft varieties, the scientists at Washington was contending that the greatest heating power is possessed by the wood of the linden tree, which is very soft.

Fire stands next to linden and almost equal to it. Then comes pine, hardly inferior to fir and linden, while hard oak possesses 8 per cent. less heating capacity than linden, and red beech 10 per cent. less.

The Kaiser on Beer.

One of the latest deliveries of the German Emperor is reported as an arraignment of the beer drinking habits of German students. From Berlin comes a despatch saying that the Kaiser has written a letter of warning against drinking to a son of Prof. Ehrhardt, who is a freshman at Freiburg University, and a member of the students' corps, in which the agility to drink great quantities of beer is one of the chief qualifications. The Kaiser said the beer habit was injurious, not only the individual student, but the German nation, with the result that both were falling behind foreigners, particularly Englishmen and Americans. The latter took a more sensible view of drinking by youths. The attitude of the Kaiser is commended by many students, but is likely to be lost upon the mass of adherents to bibulous traditions.

Alcoholism and Increasing Insanity.

Dr. Amos J. Givens, of Stratford, Conn., in the current number of one of the American medical journals, declares that insanity in New York State has increased 97 per cent. during the past twenty years, while the population has increased but 33 per cent. Dr. Givens quotes Dr. Fletcher, of Indiana, as saying that fifty or one hundred years ago it was rare to even hear of a case of insanity, now it is almost daily occurrence. Sixty or 70 per cent. of the cases of insanity are attributed to heredity, combining various causes, and alcohol is given the second place. He found the statement so far uncontradicted that fifty per cent. of all inmates of all the insane hospitals of the United States are descendants from alcoholic parents.
