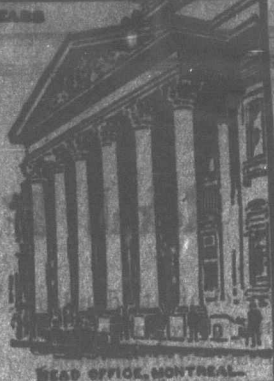

Notice of Application for Incorporation

Public Notice is hereby given that application will be made to The Honorable The Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, in Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1910, and amending Acts, incorporating Willard L. Carr, of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, and Province of New Brunswick, Lumberman; Edgar R. Teed, of the same place, Wholesale Grocer; Heber H. Hatfield, of the Town of Hartland, in the County of Carleton, Produce Merchant; Charles F. Gallagher, of Bath, in the County of Carleton, Merchant; W. Jack Dibblee, of the Parish of Northampton, in the County of Carleton, and Province of New Brunswick, Livery Stable Proprietor; Alexander L. Strong, of the Parish of Northampton, in the County of Carleton, and Province of New Brunswick, and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Saint John Valley Electric Light and Power Company, Limited."

The objects for which the incorporation of the Company is sought are as follows:

(a) For the purpose of buying, selling, generating, leasing, and using electricity for lighting, heating, communicating, power, and all other such purposes.

(b) To carry on the business of electricians, workers and dealers in electricity, motive power and light, and any business in which the application of electricity, or any like power, or any power that can be used as a substitute therefore is or may be useful, convenient or ornamental, or any other business of a like nature.

(c) To distribute, sell, lease or otherwise dispose of electric current in the Counties of Carleton, Victoria and York, and elsewhere in the Province of New Brunswick.

(d) To buy, sell, and generally deal in electrical supplies and machinery of all kinds.

(e) To acquire the right to use or manufacture and put up telephones, telegraphs, dynamos, accumulators, lamps, and all apparatus now known or that may hereafter be invented, connected with the generation, accumulation, distribution, supply and employment of electricity or any other power that can be used as a substitute therefor, including all cables, wires, or appliances, for connecting apparatus at a distance with other apparatus.

(f) To acquire the right to enter from time to time upon any public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground or highways in any city, town or parish in the Counties of Carleton, Victoria and York, break up and open such public roads, streets, squares, plots of ground or highways, or any part thereof, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and posts, and stringing and maintaining wires for telegraph, telephone, or electric light purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same, and for the placing and maintaining underground, along or across such public streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways, mains, pipes or conduits for the conveying of steam, for power or heating or for the enclosing of wires for the transmission of electricity for heating, lighting or power, and for erecting and repairing the same. To erect and maintain poles, wires, conductors and appliances for conveying electricity over, along, through, across and under any such public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground or highways, and bridges in the Parishes of Kent, Peel, Brighton, Wakefield, Northampton, Woodstock, Richmond, and the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, the Parish of Canterbury in the County of York, and the Parish of Perth, in the County of Victoria, and the public roads, bridges and highways in places adjacent thereto.

(g) To acquire by purchase and conveyance, lease or otherwise, all such lands, buildings, or real estate, works, machinery, plant, equipment and appliances as might be necessary or deemed advisable for the purposes of the Company and the carrying out of its objects.

(h) To construct, build, erect and maintain, purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire and operate works, buildings, machinery, poles, wires, and all such plant, equipment and appliances as may be necessary, usual or expedient for the objects of the Company.

(i) To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.

(j) To acquire the whole or any part of the business, property, assets, rights and liabilities of any person or Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

(k) To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others.

(l) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

The above purposes and objects to be carried out under the provisions of the above Act, having particular reference to Sections 18, 19 and 20 of said Act.

The head office and chief place of business of the Company is to be established at the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton.

The amount of capital stock of said proposed Company is Three Hundred Thousand Dollars, divided into three thousand shares of One Hundred Dollars each.
