

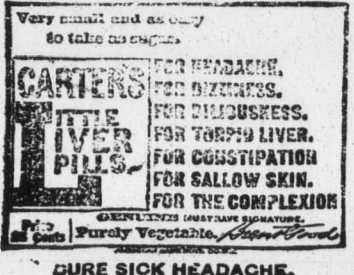

VACCINATION FOR BLACKLEG AND ANTHRAX IN CATTLE.

The disease known as Blackleg in cattle, although entirely unknown in many extensive agricultural sections of Canada and not at all wide spread in any district or province, annually causes quite extensive losses to cattle raisers. Anthrax, which is quite a different disease, although frequently confused with Blackleg in the hands of many cattle raisers, is also the cause of serious loss of stock. The former disease is almost entirely confined to cattle under 3 years and is generally fatal. The latter attacks other classes of farm animals and the human subject is not exempt from its infection which generally results seriously.

By the aid of science cattle raisers are now enabled to protect their stock against these maladies. As the human family is vaccinated against small pox, in the same manner cattle are rendered immune from Blackleg and Anthrax. The Department of Agriculture at Ottawa through the Health of Animals Branch is now in a position to supply preventive vaccine for each of these diseases at the nominal cost of five cents per dose. Until recently, by special arrangement with extensive manufacturers in the United States these products were secured at a reduced cost, and were placed in the hands of Canadian cattle raisers at ten cents per dose for Blackleg vaccine and fourteen cents per dose for Anthrax vaccine. It is due to the fact that these preparations are now being made at the Biological Laboratory in connection with the Health of Animals Branch that they can be supplied at five cents per dose.

The vaccine or Blackleg may be administered by any intelligent person by means of an instrument supplied by the Department at fifty cents.

Anthrax vaccine, which is also supplied at five cents per dose, is more difficult to administer requiring a qualified veterinarian to treat an animal.

INCREASING DEMAND FOR I. C. R. LITERATURE.

The steady increase of passenger travel over the I. C. R. and the growing interest in the "People's Railway" is most satisfactorily shown this year by the unprecedented demand for the time folders of the railway and the other publications issued by the General Passenger Department. Of time folders, a larger supply than last year has been found altogether inadequate to meet the demands of the outside agents and the distributing companies, and every day insistent appeals for more folders pour into the office. In a letter to the I. C. R. Advertising Department, Mr. J. D. Seely, manager of the Time Table Distributing Company of Canada, writes: "Our travelling agents report that they never saw the I. C. R. folders go out faster than this summer."

Another feature of interest this summer is the increased demand for the suburban folders issued between St. John and Hampton, and between Halifax and Windsor Junction. This demonstrates clearly that there has been a growth of the suburban business between the points mentioned, and that people are appreciating the improvements in the suburban train service.

With regard to the illustrated booklets and the hunting folders the same satisfactory condition of affairs exists. From all parts of Canada and the United States applications are pouring in, and the I. C. R. agents at various outside points write that they notice a growing demand for all of the I. C. R. publications.

It would certainly seem as if the I. C. R. was now reaping the harvest as a result of the vigorous advertising of past years. Passenger traffic all over the line is unprecedentedly heavy.

The Dominion King's Printer.

Dr. S. E. Dawson, King's Printer, and Comptroller of Stationery for the Dominion, who has recently been honored with a C.M.G., is one of the best known and most honored of the public servants of the capital. He is a son of the late Rev. B. Dawson of the Reformed Episcopal Church. Born at Halifax on June 1, 1833, and educated at McCullough's school in that city, he early entered the book-selling and stationery business in connection with his father. Afterwards the firm became Dawson Bros. In 1870 Mr. Dawson aided in the founding of the Dominion Bank Note Company, and one year later of the Montreal News Company. In 1881 he was appointed a delegate to Washington to confer on the subject of international copyright. He was long a member of the Board of Protestant school commissioners in Montreal, and for a time was President of the Board of Arts and Manufactures of the Province of Quebec. He was appointed to his present position in 1891, and has fulfilled its duties with credit and honor.

Dr. Dawson has been a frequent contributor to the Canadian periodicals, and was one of the earliest writers for the Canadian Monthly. His best known work is an appreciative study of Tennyson's "The Princess."

No Hindu Cremation in B. C.

Unable to secure permission from the Canadian officials to cremate their dead according to their religious beliefs, the Hindu residents of Western Canada are sending their dead to Seattle, Wash., for cremation. After cremation, the dust is scattered over the sea. According to the Hindu rites, the dead body must be covered with brush, and burned until not even the bones remain. The Canadian officials are having considerable trouble with these Orientals, who are now flooding British Columbia. The latter are again taking up the matter with the officials in regard to the creation of a Hindu crematorium, but there is small chance of success. They say that the cremation system used in Seattle is not in accordance with their religion.

The King's Private Secretary.

For 36 years Lord Knollys has been the King's private secretary, and it says much for our Sovereign's personal qualities that he has been able to attach to himself the whole-hearted devotion and unwavering fidelity of such a man. It is, indeed, devotion of a kind which mere money and titles could never purchase for any monarch, says M.A.P. Lord Knollys is the one man living from whom the King has no secrets. He controls His Majesty's enormous correspondence with marvellous ability, aided, of course, by assistant secretaries, who do the routine work. It is an impressive sight to see him in his shift sleeves tackling a mountain of letters from all manner of people. Think of the knowledge of the world, experience, tact, judgment, memory, and above all, rapid decision, which this work entails. The King must be spared in every possible way, and yet there are some letters which he must see. Cranks, faddists, inventors, and such like fearful wild-fowl are dealt with in a routine way. But there are thousands of begging letters to be sifted with the irrepressible aid of the Charity Organisation Society, for His Majesty is very tender-hearted, and would be much troubled if any genuine case were treated unsympathetically.
