INCREASED INSANITY. Ominous Figures in Report of British Commissioners. New York, Aug. 13.-A cable despatch to the Sun from London says: The report of the Commissioners of Lunacy contains ominous figures regarding the increase of insanity in Great Britain. There are now 128,787 of the certified insane, an increase of 2,763. The women exceed the men by 10,600. The criminal lunatics have increased 3.5 per cent. in the year. A noticeable feature is the high ratio of insanity among persons of the learned professions. Civil and mining engineers show the highest ratio. The commissioners favor farm colonies for the mild cases, and also an extension of the boarding-out system under supervision, with observation wards.
