Moshier, local employees of the Canadian Express Company, embraced in the Canadian Brotherhood of Station Employees, went on strike last night, A meeting was held in Victoria Hall, where the local organizer, Mr. McPherson, presided, and discussed the issue with the three hundred-odd men who attended the meeting. Many of those present only became members of the union last night.
