Electrical Display.

The illuminations throughout the city were the finest seen here since the visit of His Majesty King George as Duke of Cornwall and York, 13 years ago.

The Masonic Temple presented a magnificent sight, the architectural beauty of the building being well defined in bulbs of various colours. The front of the building was beautifully decorated with the Connaught Arms and Masonic emblems, while the south side of the Temple bore a script motto very clearly outlined in white lights, and containing the words "Welcome to our Grand Master." The side of the building is one that favors its general appearance, and last night the beauty of this imposing spectacle was admired from practically every part of the city.

The illuminations at the Railway Station gave the place a fairyland appearance, the beautiful trees in front of the building casting soft shadows in that vicinity. The effulgence of the myriads of bulbs, so artistically arranged, shone forth for many yards and their brilliance was reflected on the buildings on the opposite side of Water Street for many blocks east. The building was very effectively outlined, and the mottoes were rich in design, and the whole presented a sight that attracted thousands of citizens and held them spell bound in admiration of the beautiful scene.

The Colonial Building was richly ornamented with bulbs portraying the Crown and Royal Coat of Arms, and presented a beautiful sight. The splendid harmony of the different colors was an outstanding feature of these illuminations. The motto containing the words "Newfoundland extends a Loyal and Hearty Welcome to H.R.H. the Duke of Connaught," conveyed in a pleasing manner the old Colony's expression of welcome to the distinguished visitor.

The Government House was also beautifully decorated and illuminated and presented an attractive appearance.

The Knights of Columbus Hall was finely illuminated, the front being outlined with lights while the mottoes "K. of C." and "Welcome" shone with particular brilliancy.

The L.O.A. Hall was also attractively decorated, the contour being marked with lights, while the emblems and motto of "Welcome" were beautifully defined.

The B.I.S. T.A. & B. Star of the Sea, Mechanics and British Halls were attractively and appropriately illuminated and were much admired by the thousands of citizens who visited them during the night.

Private dwellings all over the city were also decorated and the whole showed an outburst of genuine patriotism for which the city has been particularly noted.

The illuminations of the French cruiser Friant were very much admired and appreciated. This splendid ship was beautifully outlined from stem to stern and presented a truly picturesque sight, the shadows on the still waters of the harbor adding effectiveness to the picture.

The searchlight of H.M.S. Essex also contributed much to the illuminations, and as the powerful rays of the ship's light spread over the sky, citizens from many points of vantage, drank in the beauty of the scene.

The small boy also contributed his quota to the evening's display, and from many places roman candles and miniature rockets ascended. The whole was one of the finest demonstrations seen in the city for many years, and we venture to say that the electrical display could compare favorably with that of far more pretentious cities.

City Defeat Navy.

Last evening a lively exhibition of football was served out to a large gathering of onlookers by a team from H. M. S. Essex and a representative eleven from the city. The home team were victorious by four goals to one.
