### LECTURES TO G. F. S.

Doctor starting with Bishop Inglis, traced the work of each successive Bishop up to the present Episcopate, especially dwelling on Bishop Feild the founder of the College. At the close of the lecture Lady Horwood addressed the audience for a few minutes expressing her appreciation to Rev. Dr. Facey and his assistant for their able entertainment. The manipulation of the picture machine was in the hands of a present student of the college, Mr. Reg Shephard. After singing the National Anthem the delighted audience dispersed.

## The Herring Fishery.

The herring fishery brightened the latter part of last week, and on Friday and Saturday there was very good fishing in both Humber and Middle Arms. Some boats went to North Arm on Thursday and Friday but up to the present writing we had not heard from there.

There are now several buyers herring looking for Scotch pack herring and the price being quoted is between eleven and twelve dollars. Some packers, however, are not inclined to sell at that price, claiming there is nothing in it for them owing to the high cost of labour, salt and barrels.

It was reported on Saturday that several vessels were on the way here for cargoes of salt bulk and frozen herring.

The fish of late are of a much larger run than that of the first of the season, and in Humber Arm the price is three dollars from the net, while in Middle Arm some fish have been sold at \$2.10 the schooner.—Western Star.
