When Meteors Hit Us.

Earth, that is the world we live on,

matter of fact it is but a "flea bite." It only amounts to a couple of ounces per acre annually.

This increase comes sifting down, mainly in the shape of fine dust, from the meteors which are constantly striking our atmosphere and getting burnt up into small particles.

Sometimes a meteor comes along that is too big to burn up. Some years ago one exploded oven Iowa and later there were picked up over 5,000 pieces, some running to 437 pounds

The biggest meteor that is known to have hit the earth fell at Coon Mountain, Arizona. It made a hole which even now is 560 feet deep, and three-quarters of a mile across. The

meteor itself is buried far below. What are meteors? One idea is that they are the remains of a planet which was once a member of the solar system and somehow blew up. Anyhow, meteorites have been found which contain remains of fossil sponges and of other forms of life similar to those found in our own rocks.
