PRACTITIONERS REPLY TO DR. FRASER.

Dear Sir—At a special meeting of the general practitioners of St. John's held on June 21st, 1923, we were instructed to forward the enclosed letter to you for publication.

Dear Dr. Fraser,

In our desire to encourage and assist you in the matter which you have dealt with in your letter to the Medical Profession, viz.—to defend our standing in the community, we are compelled to adopt the same method and as you yourself have seen fit to use. It seems impossible to give a satisfactory explanation of our adoption of the "open letter" method.

As far as we have been able to observe, the net result of your "open letter" has been to further foster a feeling of disrespect, ridicule and contempt in the minds and attitude of a great many of the public for our profession. This is surely the very opposite effect which you desire. Think how much good you might have accomplished by some other method.

We believe you are sincere and simply you can direct your "attempt" to defend our standing in the community in a proper and more effective manner. We are even led to wonder why you have not made an attempt sooner. The standing of the profession in the community has been a live subject for the past five or six years, and surely conditions are no worse now than they have been for at least a year, and it has even been thought that they are not quite as bad as they were a very few months ago. Have you observed this fact, and is there anything in relation to this fact which deterred you from writing an "open letter" at an earlier date?

The majority if not all the members of the profession in St. John's are ready to follow a good lead by a leader, and we believe when you have had anything to say about them they have shown every respect for your opinions. In this matter there have been numerous opportunities and there are various legitimate channels through which we are sure you might months or years ago have made effective attempts, as far as we are aware have failed to do so.

Are you aware of the fact that at a meeting of the profession in this city called by Dr. Mitchell on May 1st, 1921, the following resolution was drawn up and submitted?

"Whereas the undersigned general medical practitioners of St. John's, deeply respectfully submit a strong and insistent desire that the Prohibition Commission devise and strongly recommend to the Government, some solution by means of which the Medical Profession shall be absolutely relieved of the necessity of interfering and meeting the unreasonable requirements of the people in the matter of Alcoholic Liquors, as distinct from their immediate medical uses, signed:

Small Gardeners Encouraged.

BERLIN—In order to encourage the gardening of vacant land in and about Berlin, the state railways have taken up in half for all needy gardeners travelling to and from their gardens.

It is a practice here to lease for the spring and summer small patches of ground held for speculation or building purposes. So much of such land has been taken up by truck gardeners that there is now a continuous chain of vegetable plots encircling the city, comprising approximately 15,000 acres. The number of gardeners is 170,000, an increase of 12,000 over last year.
