in, and parties are moving from the Central States to the Mississipi, Missouri, and far beyond. These are not foreign emigrants, but chiefly Ameri cans by birth. In consequence of the stagnation of business, and the hard times in the New England and other Atlantic States, and the absence of both in the West, it is expected that the tide of emigration westward this season will be greater than it has ever been known before. It cannot be long before the whole valley between the Mississippi and the Rocky Moun-tains will be crowded with a teeming population.

Mrs. John Morrisey's private coach harness and horses are the last sensation in Troy. The Times of that city says:—"The harness is gold and silver mounted and cost \$1,000; the coach, a clarance C spring, is richly trimmed with gold, silver and silk, and cost \$2,000. 


