STILL AT IT.

CANADIAN RAILWAYS.—A return which has been laid before the House, respecting the extent of the railways in the Dominion shows that in Ontario and Quebec there are 2,188 miles of track; in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick 2,529.

CHAMBERLAIN.—The Messrs. Wilmott, of the Halton Pioneer Cheese Factory are endeavoring to open up a trade with the Lower Provinces. They shipped as an experiment this week, eight tons to New Brunswick.—Champion.

BOILER EXPLOSION.—The boiler of a steam saw mill in the township of Whitechurch exploded a week ago, and four men and two boys were very severely scalded and injured by the accident.

Parliament of Canada.

HOUSE OF COMMONS. OTTAWA, May 8.

Mr. Chamberlain moved the reception of a petition from Mr. J. K. Ramsay, praying for the impeachment of Judge Drummond. The impeachment may be regarded as the sequel of the famous Lamirande extradition case, and the infliction of \$40 fine upon Mr. Ramsay for contempt of court, in writing abusive letters respecting Judge Drummond.

Hon. Mr. Rose stated the course the Government intended to take with reference to the rate of interest on money in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. Both Banks and individuals are to charge as high as seven per cent, but no more.

The Attempted Assassination of Prince Alfred.

The following is the dispatch received in London on the 25th April, from Australia, informing the Secretary of State of the attempted assassination of Prince Alfred:—

On the 12th March a person named O'Farrell deliberately shot his Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh in the back, at a public picnic given in aid of the Sailors' Home at Clontarf, Nidle Harbour, Port Jackson. Provisionally the wound was not fatal, and he is now able to go on board his ship, and hopes shortly to resume his duties.
