

WINTER WEATHER.—There have been years in which no frost and snow whatever were seen. In 1172 so mild was the season that the trees were covered with leaves, and the birds built their nests and hatched their young in the month of February. In 1289 there was no winter, and in 1321 white blossoms were to be seen on the ordinary trees in March, and on the vine in April; cherries ripened in the latter month, and the grape in May. In 1538 the gardens were bright with flowers in January; 1572 was like 1172, and 1607, 1612, and 1617 were remarkable for their genial temperature. Neither ice nor snow was visible in 1659; no stoves were lit in Germany in 1692; and the softness of the weather in 1791, 1807, and 1822 rendered those years quite phenomenal.—The Gardener's Magazine.
