J. S. State Department Has No Sympathy With Rebellion in Nicaragua

Washington, August 18 .- The collier Justin, the state department learned today, arrived at Corinto yesterday with 350 marines, under command of Major Smedley Butler, who reported at once to the senior officer, Captain Terhune, Commanding the gunboat Annapolis, who has been given full authority to deal with the military situation. in Nicaragua as it affects American
