Old men live in the past; young men live in the future. Age looks out upon the world from the hill of reference and achievement, and calmly contemplates the winding and rocky pathway thitherward. Youth stands at the hill-foot, impatient and restless, and tries to discover the specifiest course of ascent. Give an old man half a chance and he will tell you the story of what he has done; give a young man half a chance and he will tell you the story of what he hopes to do. It was so with Jacob. Pharcah simply asked for his age. Jacob replied by remembering his years and summarizing his history. Life differs with differing standpoints. What is life to and old man? It depends upon the way he has lived it. It may be an unspeakable blessing; it may be an unsterable curse. Nothing was so satisfactory as a life well spent; nothing was so unsatisfactory as a life wasted. Might they be spared the sad retrospect of a wasted life. What is life to a youth? An unknown quantity—a beautiful dream—a startling vision—a mag nificent possibility—a solemn reality. In every man there was something worthly of angels, but the possibilities of a man la a downward course were as numerous as those of an upward. So much depends upon the way we take, so much upon the leadership we choose. If we walk in the light the blood of Jesus Christ, God's son, will cleanse us from all sin. Jacob s answer was ead, for it spoke of disappointme pilgrim spirit for a purpose. He wanted them to realize that earth was not home, them to realize that earth was not home, that the true home yet remains. He deals with us in the same way. He is constantly warning us that we must not root too deeply. He wants us to be happy here, but he does not want us to be anchored here. Earth is our inn rather than our home. Jacob spake of his days as "few" and "evil." It was natural that he should think they were few, for he looked at them from the end thereof. Moreover, comparatively, they were few; he fell far short of his fathers in the days of their pilgrimage. But of infinitely more importance his fathers in the days of their pilgrimage. But of infinitely more importance than the length of a man's days is the quality of them. Let them put quality into their days, and leave the number of them to God. It is a notable fact that the fullest lives are often the briefest. But Jacob's days were evil. No one could dispute that. Nevertheless, he was saved at last. Jacob was a monument of divine mercy. Only God could make a decent man out of such poor material. Few and evil were the days of the very best of us. But thank God our days, though few, might be redeemed, and to redeem them was to lengthen them; it was to cleanse them from all evil. God in Christ had provided for this.
