At the Woodbine.

Toronto, May 17.—There was a regular race day crowd on hand at the Woodbine track today, and they saw faster trails than were ever made at the Woodbine before. Seagram's good horses were brought down from Little York, but were given only a strong open gallop. Dalmor romping along in impressive style, and beating the trying to break his stride to get by him. Joss and Sea Song made the circuit in 1:49. Livonian went through the field as if he were traveling in a hot air balloon. Enclaire and Vanmount ran a mile and a quarter in 2:20. Euclaire winning, Dymen's platter, Magog, has been banked down from 20 to 13 to 3 to 1 within a week. Seagram's 2-year-olds are all sick at Sheepshead Bay, and will not be brought to the Woodbine.
