2.000 Armenians Killed in Recent Riots-Russ Reservist

St. Petersburg, March 16, 2 a.m.—Private nan advices from the Caucasus indicate that the situation there has not been exaggerated. According to one letter, the Armenians estimate the number of their Armenians estimate the number of their dead at 2,000.
