

#### THE INJUNCTION WILL **NOT STOP POWER LINE**

The H. E. P. Commission Will Continue the Work to Supply Port Arthur

With Energy. Toronto, Nov. 26. — The hydro-electric power commission is not going to pay any attention to the Port Arthur injunction, so far as the actual work of constructing transmission lines, power stations, etc., is concerned. It will, of course, be obeyed so far as entering into any agreement with the city is concerned. The work of constructing the power line from Kakabeka Fails to the city and of building the transformer station will be proceeded with

at once.
This was learned from official circles this morning, and is contingent on the re-submitting of the hydro-electric bylaw in the northern town. Hon. Adam Beck wired to Port Arthur to this effect last night before leaving for

Montreal. Port Arthur has twice adopted a bylaw in favor of the hydro, and twice it has been stopped by technicalities. The contract of the city with Mr. Jas. Conmee's corporation, the Ontario and Michigan Power Company, expires in March next, and unless an agreement can be reached with the hydro-electric to go into effect before that time the city will be compelled to sign an interim contract with the Conmee company.
