Fuller details are, however, obtainable from the statements since compiled for Parliament by the Customs Department. The tables showing the movement of our trade with our various foreign customers are perhaps the most interesting. They show that Great Britain is preeminently Canada's best market at present. Our sales to the Mother Country during the last fiscal year were 50 per cent. larger than our sales to the United States. As recently as 1889 the Americans were our best purchasers. Their hostile legislation, coupled with the efforts of the Canadian Government to develop British trade, has welded the commercial interests of England anada more solidly together.
