

PROVINCIAL RIGHTS. A Constitutional Question Comes up Before the Supreme Court of British Columbia.

VICTORIA, B.C., Feb. 14 .- The constiution case was decided yesterday in the supreme court, Justice Beglie, Crease, and Gray sitting. The court unanimously decides "that the court of appeals formed by the local government is not a provincial court within the meaning of the British North America act; that the local legisla-North America act; that the local legisla-ture has no control over its procedure, and cannot legislate or prevent suitors having access to the court having cases heard and carried to final abjudication so as to have appeal to the supreme court of Canada that the local legislature cannot make rules that the local legislature cannot make rules to govern the procedure of the court or delegate power to the lieutenant-governor in council to do so; that the application of the judicial districts acts to judges ap-pointed and holding commissions prior to its enactment is unconstitutional; that the judges are Dominion and not provincial districts act for the better administration of justice and the act for the local adminis-tration of justice are ultra vires; that the tration of justice are ultra vires ; that the plaintiff in the case is entitled to have the relief asked for, and the court is bound to hear the motion and permit him to proceed with the cause." The points involved are important and the decision creates a sensation in legal circles.
