### PERISHED IN A HOTEL FIRE

ANOTHER AFFLICTING DISASTER IN NEW YORK

The Hotel Royal Totally Destroyed and Numbers of Guests Cremated in the Flames—Women and Children Rushed to the Windows and Children Headed and Despair Leap to Death on the Pavement Below, or Fall Back Into the Eerie Maelstrom.

NEW YORK, Feb. 7.—An appalling catastrophe paralleling in horror and perhaps exceeding in loss the Park Place disaster of last summer, occurred in the city this morning at an early hour. The Hotel Royal, situated on the corner of Broadway and West Street, was completely destroyed by fire and a large number of people were burned and suffocated in the ruins.

The Hotel Royal was built more than twenty years ago by persons in the theatrical profession and was patronized chiefly by theatrical people. It was a large building, kept late hours in the upper part of the ten-story structure.

The fire broke out shortly after three o'clock this morning and spread with fearful rapidity, the flames soon enveloping the entire building, and cutting off all means of escape for the guests remaining in the upper stories of the building.

The fire department arrived within a few minutes after the alarm was given by a fireman on the street. The fire was under control by the time the firemen reached the hotel, but the damage was done.
