WHAT THE PROVINCIAL BOARD OF HEALTH SAYS.

The City Fathers Are Trifling With a Grave Danger—The People Drink Boiled Sewage—Filtration Recommended—Presentations in View of a Cholera Outbreak—The Board Seeks Fresh Powers.

The quarterly meeting of the Provincial Board of Health was held yesterday. Dr. Cassidy, the president, was in the chair. The other members present were Mrs. McDonald, Vaux, and Secretary Bryce.

The chairman's annual address. It was an elaborate document. It stated that the most striking fact in the sanitary world is the deepened and universal dread of cholera, both in Europe and America.

Dr. Cassidy then gave the report of the Ottawa conference, the proceedings at which have already been mentioned in this column.

The chairman referred to the intestinal effects in diarrhoea and typhoid fever. He said even if the pipe extending across Toronto Bay were made water-tight there would still be danger that it could be kept so.

At considerable length the chairman recommended the Hyatt filters. They were made in Canada and are of the best quality.

Need of Vaccination. Advertising to the smallpox outbreak the chairman pointed out the importance of vaccination and disinfection.
