**To Improve Our Earth Roads.**

In order to start a movement to improve the condition of earth roads in Ontario. "The Farmer's Advocate," in co-operation with the public works department of the Ontario government, is offering \$100 in prizes for the best results from a season's use of the inexpensive implement called the split-log drag. There are two sets of prizes one for the eastern and one for the western part of the province. The first prize in each case is \$25, second prize, \$15, and third prize, \$10. There is no fee to enter, and the conditions are very simple. The judging will be done by Mr. A. W. Campbell, Good Roads commissioner. We might add that the entries for this exceedingly interesting and practical competition will close on March 27th.

**Horses for the West.**

Glencoe, March 11.—The northwest fever has broken out again here with greater intensity than ever. People desirous of going to the west experience great difficulty in securing cars. Nearly everyone going is taking a full complement of horses allowed in a car with settlers' effects, i. e., ten horses or cattle. Many are shipping full cars of horses. Four carloads of horses left this place on Saturday for the west, in addition to one for the old country. Some buyers are taking all sorts and conditions of horses. They claim it is possible to make good money out of them, the demand for cheap horses being so great in the west. It is a good thing for this part of the country, as all the old scrubs are being gathered up and taken away, enhancing the price of the horses that remain.
