Paper Advancing.

Existing conditions in the paper market in Canada, United States and Europe have caused all wholesale paper houses in this country to notify customers that all quotations on paper are withdrawn and prices will be advanced without further notice. This becomes a very serious matter in all country newspaper offices from the fact that not one newspaper in ten is paying expenses now. Any profit such publishers are making is from advertising and now. job printing and only a few country publishers are making more than a bare living at best. Publishers must take immediate action to protect themselves because of this increase in price of paper and wages— there must be a general advance in all kinds of job printing, advertising space in the papers and in subscription. It is a well-known fact that merchants are constantly advancing prices on some line of goods as wholesale houses advance prices to them but the poor printer has struggled along in fear and trembling lest he may lose a customer by asking a proper price for his work. Honestly we doubt if there is any other line of business in this country which requires so much capital investment that gives so small returns as the ordinary country newspaper office. We mean by country newspaper office all such offices outside of the larger cities. Take the newspaper business in this town for the past thirty years. Line up the ten or more men who have tried to make a newspaper pay. Where are they to-day? Every man of them has gone from the town a wiser but sadder man. The last man who ran a newspaper office here told us that he left Bowmanville about \$500 worse off than when he came here and he
