FIVE MURDERED AT HEMFORD

to Death by Havelock Veinot

Drowsing peacefully in the beauty of the early sunny Sunday morning, the hamlet of Hemford, Lunenburg Co, a few miles from New Germany, was been deliberately and coldly murdere

From seven o'clork that morning until noon, scenes indescriable have both vitriol-bitten into the memory plats of those who beheld them. This murderer did not run amuck. He sho his own father in the most deliberate and calculating manner. Then he se forth and shot a man and his wife which deed he followed up by killing another man, a near neighbor. Returning home, he finished his father with a bullet. Then he blew his own brains out.

The murdered are: William Veino the father of the murderer and suicide Albert Ritcey, Adelia Ritcey, his wife, and Archibald Synder. The man who murdered them and took his own life was Havele k Veinot, 45 years old, a bachelor, who lived with his parents One victim is survived by a widow and thirteen children.
