MILK SETTING.—The setting of milk requires two things—time and space. Time furnishes itself; space must be provided. In winter it must be in warm quarters; in summer, coolness is demanded. EDUCATING HORSES.—Says the English Veterinarian: "Horses can be educated to the extent of their understanding as well as children."

COVERING SEED TOO DEEPLY.—A great deal of seed, says a farmer, is buried annually, instead of being sown. This is frequently the reason why seed fails to grow. It is put down beyond the reach of sun and air.

COMMON SENSE IN FARMING.—Some agricultural writer has very correctly observed, that "True farming consists largely in the exercise of common sense." This is more or less true of all vocations, and assuredly there is abundant scope for this quality in conducting the operations of the farm.

THE HIRED MEN OF THE FARM.—As a class, the hired men of the farm are rapidly becoming one of the greatest trials of farming; not only on account of their incompetency, but because of their immorality and profanity.

EARLY SOWING.—The following strong evidence in favor of early sowing is given a Schoharie County (N. Y.) farmer in a recent issue of the Country Gentleman: Experience and observation both teach me that in this country we cannot sow our spring grain too early.

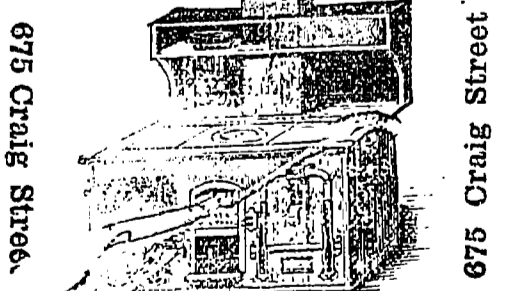
