

so to the Office of Protocol of the Department of External Affairs at least one month before the parents' final departure. If approval is granted, the diplomatic and consular personnel must then apply to the local Canada Immigration Centre for the issuance of student authorizations to the dependents. Moreover, the dependents' identity cards must be returned to the Office of Protocol and their passports shall be submitted for cancellation of their acceptances.

21.2. Student Fees

Dependents of diplomatic and consular officers in Canada may be permitted by educational institutions to pay the Canadian, instead of the foreign, student fees.

Dependents remaining in Canada to complete their education after their parents' final departure from Canada may not be permitted by educational institutions to continue to pay the Canadian, instead of the foreign, student fees.

22. Health Insurance Plans

Diplomatic and consular officers and their dependents may be able to participate in provincial health insurance plans. Coverage is terminated on the completion of the diplomatic and consular officers' assignment in Canada. Information and forms may be obtained from the Office of Protocol of the Department of External Affairs or the provincial offices of protocol.

23. Driving

23.1. Driver's Examinations

In Ontario, Quebec, and British Columbia, diplomatic and consular officers and their eligible dependents who hold valid foreign driver's licences may not be required to take driver's examinations.

For information on exemption from driver's examinations in the other Provinces the diplomatic or consular mission should contact the provincial offices of protocol.

23.2. Driver's Licences

In Ontario, diplomatic and consular officers and their eligible dependents who hold valid foreign driver's licences may be issued free driver's licences on the basis of reciprocity. The applicant shall submit an application form,
