Of the Municipal Council of the County of Lambton, in the Province of Ontario, praying for the passing of a Prohibitory Liquor Law.

Of the said Municipal Council, praying that measures may be taken to improve the navigation of the North Sydenham River from Wallaceburg to Wilkesport.

The Honorable Mr. Kaulbach moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Macfarlane, That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, all papers and correspondence between the Government of Canada and the Inspector of Customs for the Province of Nova Scotia, or any of the Custom House officers in the County of Lunenburg, in the said Province, or any other Government officials in relation to the violation of the Deck Load Law, with Government instructions, if any, to its officers relative to the enforcement of said Law.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.

The Honorable Mr. Campbell moved, seconded by Honorable Mr. Allan, That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, a Statement showing the use which has been made of any portions of the steel rails purchased by the Government, and of the quantity remaining unused the end of 1875, and where these rails are at present.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.

The Honorable Mr. Campbell moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Allan That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, a Return showing the general nature and the value of all Manufactured Goods imported into Canada from the United States in the years 1873, 1874 and 1875.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.

The Honorable Mr. Campbell moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Allan, That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, a Statement showing approximately the expenditure made on account of the *Pacific* Railway and its branches, and the Telegraph Line proposed to be constructed in connection therewith since the year 1873, and in general terms the extent of work accomplished in each of the following divisions, namely, East of *Georgian Bay*, between *Thunder Bay* and *Fort Garry*, between *Fort Garry* and *Pembina*, West of *Fort Garry* and East of the Rocky Mountains and in British Columbia.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative and it was

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.
