

"3. That the appointment of such members be made in the usual way, by the Board of Governors on the recommendation of the Principal.

"4. That other members of the staff, not members of the Faculty, who give graduate courses of instruction of an approved character, be listed as Associates of the Faculty in their respective Departments in every announcement of this Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research.

"5. That the Functions of the Faculty be inter alia:-

(a) To approve of the courses submitted by the heads of Departments giving graduate instruction.

(b) To lay down conditions in which students may become candidates for higher degrees.

(c) To conduct examinations for such degrees.

"6. That the routine executive work of the Faculty, such as the acceptance and registration of students, the determination of the courses which they must take, the determination of the students' fulfilment of the requirements, and the making of arrangements for the examinations to be taken by the students, be in charge of an Executive Committee appointed by the Faculty, which shall report, at stated intervals, its proceedings to the Faculty as a whole."

From a study of this report and of the proceedings of Corporation and Board of Governors, it will be seen that "the Faculty will consist of heads of departments and certain others on the staff of the University who offer and give bona fide courses of instruction of a graduate character and superintend research work for the higher degrees;" and that "the appointment of such members be made by the Board of Governors on the recommendation of the Principal".

As far as I know, these regulations have never been changed; certainly no changes have been brought before the Board of Governors for confirmation. Yet it is a fact that in recent years men have been asked to join the Faculty without any reference to me whatever, and certainly many professors now sitting as members of the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research have never been confirmed in that position in the regular way. It would seem that this loose way of doing things began
