functions of provisional Lieutenant Governor of the Province,
displayed qualities admirably adapted to awe the disloyal,
to reconcile the wavering, and animate the great mass of
the Inhabitants against successive attempts of the
enemy to invade the Province, in the last of
which he unhappily fell, too prodigal of that
life of which his eminent services had
taught us to understand the value.
