INVERNESS.

The Rev. P. Roe reports:-

The services and Sunday School work have been going on regularly in this Mission until the 13th October, when I was absent (on leave) for some weeks. During my absence, I was indebted to my good brother, the Revd. T. L. Ball, for a service at St. Stephens on the 20th October, and to my kind neighbour, the Rev. John Kemp, for another service at Campbell's school-house on Sunday, the 3rd November. During the fine weather, the services at all the stations have been well attended; in rough weather and bad roads, there is always a great falling off.

The Rev. Rural Dean Fothergill paid an official visit to the Mission on Sunday, the 24th February; he preached to a large congregation at St. Stephens and administered the Holy Communion to thirty-three members; he at the same time took occasion to address the congregation on the readjustment of the Diocesan assessment.

On Sunday, the 17th March, the Lord Bishop held an ordination service in St. Stephens, when I was admitted to the Holy order of the priesthood. There was a very large attendance from all parts of the Mission, and many had to go away, not being able to obtain admission. The Rev.
