





"We have been dissatisfied with our county taxes because Oakville is as-sessed much higher than many other towns in the county and has natural-ly to contribute a larger share of the taxes on that account. We don't think our assessment is too high, but because all our property is rated higher by the assessor we have to pay a larger amount in taxes to the county than we would if the assessor took a more conservative view of land values ". 
