The Frenchman played sterling bliliards in many innings, his best runs being productive of 98, 75 and 66.

Outgamed Southern Cross Under a Terrific Drive-Record Crowd at Aqueduct.

Aqueduct, April 16.—Roseben, backed lown from 3 to 1 to 11 to 5, won the Carer Handicap here to-day in a terrific drive by a head from Southern Cross, a long shot, with Red Knight third.

record for the distance, 7 furlongs, stepping the start and set a terrific pace, followed by Hermitage and Green Room. This order remained the same to the stretch, where, Southern Cross, under Baird's hard riding, closed up on the favorite, and a hard drive, which lasted all thru the final eighth, resulted in a victory for the favorite, amid the rousing cheers of 20,000 persons.

Roseben was always the favorite, financially and sentimentally, when he led the post procession past one of the largest crowds the Aqueduct track ever held, is was loudly applauded, and when his winning number was posted after the exciting finish there was tumultuous cheering. Opening at 2½ to 1, his price went to 3, to recede to 11 to 5 at post time.

Roseben has hitherto been a six-furlong sprinter, and many persons would not back him to-day because of the Carter distance.

Hermitage and Green Room ran with the winner for the first two furlongs, but he had a clear lead entering the stretch, when Southern Cross came up.

Phil Finch, the sensational weight-carrier and handlcap winner of the winter season at New Orleans, was never prominent in to-day's race.

Lord of the Vale was another big disappointment. His chances for victory were fancied by many.

Horse Show Entries Complete.
