THE mail carrier from Sooke yesterday brought to Victoria the news of a particularly and fatality, the victim being the little four-year-old daughter of a settler named Phillips, whose sister, Mrs. A. White, resides on Randall street; it was her information that the child, a fire had been started for the purpose of clearing brush, not far from the house, and the children, of whom there are several, amused themselves by playing about it. A fire of four and a half years' standing was near the blaze, her clothing took fire and soon she had been burned beyond all hope of recovery—in fact, she lived only about half an hour.

THE sealing schooner Ocean Belle, which returned from the Copper Island coast on Wednesday afternoon and docked at Capt. Grant's wharf, was robbed during the night of her arrival of 163 seal skins, half a dozen seal pups and a valuable shot gun, the total value of the missing property being upwards of \$2,000. How the seal skins were removed was not hard to discover; the booty hatch had been lifted from the combings and the pelts handed up and passed over the side to a boat in waiting. The second mate, who spent the night on board, heard nothing, but was too intoxicated to know what had been transpiring around him.

He made a casual inspection and then "turned in," not reporting the robbery until morning, when he communicated the facts to Mr. Hall, the owner. It is evident that the thieves were well acquainted with the vessel and the probability is that the plunder was taken away in one of the boats belonging to a schooner owned by Mr. William Munroe, from which it was missed yesterday morning. The owner of the Belle has offered a reward of \$250 to stimulate the search for the missing property and the conviction of the thieves.

ENGLISH IN THE SYNAGOGUE.

A Cause of Disension in the Local Hebrew Congregation Has Disappeared.

"I have news which ought to be good," said Rabbi Philo yesterday to a COLONIST reporter who had called upon him. "You see, my son, that for the future the services in the Temple Emanuel E. will be conducted mainly in the English language, Hebrew being used very little. We are going to adopt all means to satisfy all the members of the congregation, young and old, and as far as I can see all will be agreeable to the change. English is the language of the community, and therefore more attention is paid to it than to any other. Unfortunately only a small proportion of the Jews understand the Hebrew language well enough to follow the prayers when said in that tongue; but I think it is the proper thing anyhow that we Jews should understand the native language—English—in this English community."

The Rabbi explained that this change is a return to the former custom in the Temple, and that the recent adoption of Hebrew had not proved so popular as expected, and had led to a falling off in the attendance at worship.

The Rabbi asks to have a correction made of a statement appearing in the article on the Day of Atonement published a couple of days ago.

"It is not so," he said, "that the word 'mumsh' means 'mildly.' It means 'additional' and nothing else."
