Hamilton Happenings

JOHN HENRY CASE WAS INVESTIGATED

Charges Pressed by Trades and Labor Council - General News of Ambitious City.

HAMILTON, Sept. 24 .- (Special.)he board of works and fuel committee his evening investigated charges made against John Henry, a carpenter employed to erect a shed for the city, and came to this finding: "We find that the fuel committee engaged John Henry to do the job, and that the men engaged on the job were employes of Mr. Henry and not city employes, and that their names should not have been or the city pay rolls. We are of the opinion that Mr. Henry should have reopinion that Mr. Henry should have re-turned the pay envelopes of the men unopened, and sued for payment in bulk, and altho the transaction was conducted somewhat irregularly, the city has suffered no loss, and we remend in the future that more care be taken in carrying out such work. The charges were pressed by the Trades and Labor Council, Wm. Berry being their spokesman. He said Mr. Henry drew pay from the city at the rate of 37 cents an hour for his men, and that he opened their envelopes, allowing the men only 20, 25 and 30 cents, and that while he was drawing 40 cents hour for acting as foreman of the nen, he was often employed at a private contract at the mountain., Henry's defence was that he had the men engaged for years at the wages he allowed them; that they should not have been on the civic pay rolls; that the difference between what he allowed and what he drew for the men was his profit, and that when he was not acting as foremen he supplied a nother ng as foreman he supplied another
