LOCAL MARKET.

LONDON, Wednesday, May 22.

The demand for hay in the early part of the market was slow; later on trade was brisker. There were 22 loads offered, and they were disposed of at \$13.50 to \$15 per ton. There should be an excellent demand for hay tomorrow, as Friday is a holiday and there will not be any offered on Saturday. Straw sold today at \$6 per ton, and \$4.25 per load. On Tuesday it was \$1.25 to \$1.40 per cwt.

WEEKLY REVIEW.

The markets held here in the past six days were up to the average for this time of the year. There was a brisk demand in every line and prices were firm.

Grain—Oats are about the only kind of grain that is marketed. There is an excellent demand and prices are higher at \$1.35 to \$1.40 per cwt. This is 4c to 5c to 4c to 3c per bushel. There has been only one load of wheat offered during the past week, consequently it is hard to tell what the price would be if there was any quantity offered. Barley sells at \$1.10 per cwt, but very little is offered.

Hay and Straw—There was a large number of loads of hay offered during the past week; the demand is good, and prices are firm at \$14 to \$15 per ton. Straw is a trifle slow at \$6 per ton, and occasionally \$6.50 is paid.

Butter and Eggs—Butter is firm and the prospects are that prices will remain steady for some time; the dealers expected to see prices down to about 16c per lb by this time, but as the pasture is not of the best, and the English markets are firm for both cheese and butter, prices at present are 20c to 22c for crocks and 22c for pound rolls, in wholesale lots. Eggs are in good demand at 16c to 16½ for crate and basket lots.

Poultry—There is not much doing in this line, as the supply is small; spring chickens are in fair demand, at 25c per lb alive and 20c dressed; by the pair, 70c to 80c alive and 75c to 80c dressed; last season's fowl are in good demand at 10c per lb alive and 8c to 9c dressed; ducks are wanted by the dealers at 13c per lb alive; turkeys sell at 12c to 14c per lb dressed.

Apples—Very few are offered at present. Potatoes—Although the supply has increased of late, the demand is brisk and prices are firm, at \$1.15 to \$1.25 per bag, according to the number of bags purchased.

Dressed Hogs—Prices are firm, at \$8.75 per cwt; not many offered.

Live Hogs—The price for Monday's shipment will be \$6.75 per cwt for select; this is an advance of 25c per cwt since last week.

Butchers' Meats—Veal is dull of sale, at \$6 to \$7.25 per cwt; beef is selling fairly well at \$6.50 to \$7.25 per cwt; mutton is in demand, at \$6 to \$7 per cwt; lamb is scarce, at \$6 to \$7 per cwt for spring lamb, and 15c to 16c for yearlings.

Hides and Wool—No change in prices from last week's quotations.
